Nothing Bundt Cake Copycat

Prep Time: 10 minutes

Bake Time: 45 minutes

Ingredients for Cake:

1 box Yellow Cake Mix

1 small box Vanilla Instant Pudding

8 ounce Sour Cream

1/2 cup Water

1/2 cup Oil

1 teaspoon Vanilla Extract

4 Eggs

Ingredients for Frosting:

1-1/2 to 2 cups Powder Sugar

1/4 cup Butter

1 teaspoon Vanilla Extract

8 ounce Cream Cheese

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F,

and grease and flour your bundt cake pan.

2. Mix the first seven cake ingredients together.

3. Pour batter into your greased bundt cake pan. Bake at 350 for 45-50 min. Allow to cool in the pan for 20 min., then remove from pan and place on wire cooling rack.

For the Cream Cheese Frosting:

1. Cream together the cream cheese and butter. Mix in the vanilla. Gradually stir in the powdered sugar until smooth.

Frosting the cake:

1. Spoon frosting into a pastry bag with no tip attached. Starting in the



hole of the bundt cake, squeeze and drag frosting up and over the cake. Decorate as you please, I chose to decorate with beautiful flowers - ENJOY!



Going Against the Flow

"But the whole assembly talked about stoning them." Numbers 14:10a Have you ever had to stand up against the majority for a cause that wasn't popular? God brought the Israelites out of Egypt and promised He would lead them into a land of milk and honey. The process of moving out of Egypt was difficult. They could no longer do things the old way, for the old ways didn't work in the desert. God provided for them during this journey. But there came a point in which the people forgot what God had said. Their discomfort changed their belief about God.

Whenever God is slow to answer our prayers, He is working them out. Do we change our plans and move in a different direction when pressure mounts? Or do we continue on the path God has directed for us? Four men believed what God said and were willing to stand; however, the crowd wanted to stone them.

When Moses and Aaron fell face down in front of the whole Israelite assembly gathered there. Joshua, son of Nun, and Caleb, son of Jephunneh, who were among those who had explored the land, tore their clothes and said to the entire Israelite assembly, "The land we passed through and explored is ex-

ceedingly good. If the Lord is pleased with us, He will lead us into that land, a land flowing with milk and honey, and will give it to us. Only do not rebel against the Lord. And do not be afraid of the people of the land, because we will swallow them up. Their protection is gone, but the Lord is with us. Do not be afraid of them."

But the whole assembly talked about stoning them. Then the glory of the Lord appeared at the Tent of Meeting to all the Israelites (Numbers 14:5-10).

Notice Joshua's and Caleb's response to the situation. They had spied the land. They believed God. They challenged the crowd. They seemed to know that if the Lord was not pleased with them they would not enter into the Promised Land. Those who grumbled did not enter the Promised Land. Only Joshua and Caleb and a new generation saw the fulfillment of God's promise.


Has God called you to stand for a cause bigger than yourself? You will have opposition to His call; sometimes it even comes from those in your own camp. But if God has called you, then you can be sure He will make a way. He has already opened

the way before you. But you must walk in faith, joined with Him to take the land.

"...Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9).



Hello Brothers and Sisters,





Your Health Matters...Managing OA

Osteoarthritis (OA) is the most common form of arthritis, affecting millions. It occurs when the protective cartilage on the ends of your bones wears down over time — the unavoidable result of a long and active life. Some risk factors for OA, like aging, being female, certain jobs, genetics and bone deformities, can't be changed. Although the underlying process cannot be reversed, symptoms can usually be effectively managed. To slow progression of OA and help improve pain and joint function, doctors recommend you:

Maintain A Healthy Weight: Excess weight is one of the biggest risk factors. Each pound you gain adds nearly 4 pounds of stress to knees and increases pressure on hips six-fold. Over time, the extra strain breaks down the cartilage that cushions these joints.

Unless you are very overweight, losing even a few pounds can reduce joint stress and inflammation, cutting your risk of OA in half.

Control Blood Sugar: The latest research suggests that diabetes, which affects the body's ability to regulate

blood sugar (glucose), may be a significant risk factor for OA. Diabetes can also trigger systemic inflammation that leads to cartilage loss.

Get Physical: Physical activity is one of the best ways to keep joints healthy. As little as 30 minutes of moderately-intense exercise 5 times a week helps joints stay limber and strengthens the muscles that support and stabilize your hips and knees.

Whatever type of exercise you choose, listen to your body. If you have pain after a workout that persists more than 1-2 hours, do less, take more breaks, go slow until you know how your body reacts and don't repeat the same exercise every day. The Arthritis Foundation's "Walk With Ease" program can help you reach your goals.

Play It Safe: Because cartilage doesn't heal well, an injured joint is nearly 7 times more likely to develop arthritis. Fractures, dislocations, ligament tears and strains can significantly increase the risk.

Choose A Healthy Lifestyle: Ul-



timately, the best defense against any disease is a healthy lifestyle. The way you eat, exercise, sleep, manage stress, interact with others, as well as smoking or drinking can have a tremendous influence on your overall health, and on the health of your joints.

If you have joint pain, tenderness, swelling, loss of flexibility, grating sensation, bone spurs or stiffness that won't go away, talk to your doctor about treatment options.

There's An App for That



I discovered this App just in time for our last summer road trip to Canada. It's called "Toll"... It may not allow you to avoid all

the toll roads along your trip, however it will allow for you to predict and calculate your toll expenses before you arrive at the toll booth.

This App factors in your weight, height, trailer if any, number of axles, dual tires, time of day and more, to give you an accurate rate for your toll purchase.

This App works great on all toll roads anywhere in the U.S. and Canada. I found that this App was designed to save on those toll charges for RVer's and truckers.

The way it works is, you provide a starting and destination point and the App will calculate your toll charges along the route. You can even put in multiple routes at the same time. If you have any of those frequent toll passes it even calculates accurately what your expected charges will be. You can even select different times for travel to see the differences in toll charges.

This App is really worth checking out if you travel often on toll roads and you want to factor in the expense in your trip planning.

This App is available for iPhone and Android.
